Rehabbing Birds and Other Wildlife


Our speaker will be Allyson Lee, a licensed veterinarian technician with the Wildlife Care Alliance, a group of home-based wildlife rehabilitators located throughout southwest Virginia.

Explains Allyson, "The members of our Alliance care for native Virginia animals that are sick, injured or orphaned, always with the goal of returning them to the wild once they are healthy enough to survive. My talk will cover how we do it, how it's funded, and different ways people can help."

Allyson's areas of specialization are reptiles and adult songbirds. She also stabilizes raptors before sending them on to centers that have the space to care for them properly.

For her presentation to the Bird Club, Allyson will emphasize the rehabilitation of wild birds. Accompanying her will be two non-releasable "ambassador birds," a screech owl and a peregrine falcon.

With ornithologist Paul Cabe leading, we'll go in search of woodland residents, nesters, and passers-through along the Brushy Hills trails. Paul is a W&L Professor of Biology with interests in conservation genetics and, of course, birds.
